

## Editorial

The year of 2010 starts at *Interpersona* with six articles representing Relationship Research conducted in Brazil. In line with previous editions of *Interpersona*, this issue aims at showcasing interpersonal relationship research from a country up and coming in that field, as much as in many other areas of investigation. As Editors we believe that the present issue of *Interpersona* may foster international partnerships with Brazilian relationship research centers.

This Volume 4 Issue 1 (2010) introduces three articles in English and three in Brazilian Portuguese. Reppold, Hutz and Hutz conducted a study with adopted adolescents, bringing into focus psychological adjustment. Dagnoni and colleagues present an evaluation of electronic diaries as a tool to assess couple's empathic accuracy. Souza and Rodrigues discuss Internet-mediated adolescent relationships. Binsfeld and Lisboa approach the bullying phenomenon and examine the related issues of social roles, anxiety and depression in school-aged children. Zortea and Tokumaru examine family relationships in social-economic context. Finally, Borloti and colleagues present a study on women, coping and stress situations in relationships.

Each manuscript was evaluated by two independent experienced researchers.
